WAIKATO CATCHMENT ECOLOGICAL ENHANCEMENT CHARITABLE TRUST (INC) TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 1 JULY 2007 TO 30 JUNE 2008

Executive Summary

This is the fifth annual report for the Waikato Catchment Ecological Enhancement Charitable Trust (Waikato Catchment Ecological Enhancement Trust). This has been a year of strategic review and planning for the Trust's future direction.

- The Trust received 23 applications for project funding in this year's grant round of which 12 were confirmed for funding with the final decision on a further 3 held-over pending further information. The Trust made grants to projects totaling \$188,395 for 2008 as well as committing to a payments of \$368,305 for 2009 which includes a contribution of \$309,375 to a major wetland development project adjacent to the Waikato River and downstream from the Ohaaki Power Station. Other funded projects were scattered throughout the wider catchment and include ongoing commitments to some wetland projects in the Taupo and Rotorua areas being major grant recipients.
- The trust received a report from Alchemists Ltd which gave an analysis of potential gaps in existing ecological work programmes by key agencies in the Taupo Ecological District. This report indicates that the trust's current allocation of funds to that district is meeting existing needs to foster that district's ecological resources.
- In recognition that the Trust was in its fifth year it was decided that it was relevant to undertake a strategic review of our activities. This process was facilitated during a meeting at Turangi which also allowed trustees to visit and view a number of the project sites in the Taupo area.
- In order to satisfy a requirement of the New Zealand Charities Commission regarding the
 charitable objectives of the Trust, and acting on legal advice, changes were made to the wording
 of the Trust's objectives. These changes removed reference to the receipt of monitoring reports
 from Mighty River Power in order to remove any suggestion that the Trust might have a noncharitable function that provided benefit to Mighty River Power.
- During the year the Trustees have continued to act upon the advice of their investment consultant to maintain their structured portfolio based on secured banking bonds to provide income for investment into projects in the coming years.

1. Background

The Waikato Catchment Ecological Enhancement Trust was formed with the execution of the Trust's Trust Deed on 13 June 2003. The Trust originated from the process of replacing the resource consents for the continued operation of the Waikato Hydro System. Mighty River Power, the owner and operator of the Waikato Hydro Scheme applied under the Resource Management Act (RMA) to replace the expiring resource consents that authorise the operation of the Hydro Scheme. Those organisations who are parties to this Trust worked together to develop an appropriate response in RMA terms to those applications. They recognised that there are a variety of ecological changes occurring in Lake Taupo, the Waikato River and hydro lake environments as a result of natural processes, other activities in the catchment and the operation of the Hydro Scheme.

The formation of this Trust was a significant part of the response of those organisations to developing a practical means of achieving:

- an acceptable response to the ongoing ecological changes occurring throughout the Lake Taupo and Waikato River catchments;
- · an acceptable response to changes associated with the operation of the Waikato hydro system; and,
- · wider ecological benefits in the Lake Taupo and Waikato River catchments.

2. Purposes of the Trust

The Waikato Catchment Ecological Enhancement Trust was established for the following charitable purposes:

- To foster and enhance the sustainable management of the ecological resources in the Lake Taupo and Waikato River catchments;
- To mitigate adverse effects of the operation of the Hydro Scheme on the ecological environments in the Lake Taupo and Waikato River catchments;
 - i) identifying important habitats and/or species;
 - (ii) identifying risks and threats to those identified habitats and/or species;
 - (iii) identifying practical means to enhance important habitats and/or species;
 - (iv) establishing an enduring and beneficial working partnership between Mighty River Power and the Trust; and

3. Primary Activities of the Trust in 07/08

The Trust utilised its own networks and those of its Trustees and connected organisations to notify its funding round. The Trust received 23 applications for project funding which was greater than the preceding year. While the standard of applications was generally high and many projects had merited, the Trustees maintained their stringent selection criteria such that only projects that provided clear benefits for ecological enhancement and an ability to support habitat or mitigate the adverse effects of the hydro scheme operation were selected for funding. Twelve projects were confirmed for funding. Trustees also expressed keen interest in a further three projects which were of interest but for which further detail and planning was requested before a final commitment to funding could be agreed.

The most significant project supported in this grant round was a wetland development venture promoted by Fish and Game New Zealand – Eastern Region at Ohaaki. WCEET has committed \$326,250 over 3 years to a project of over \$1 million (in partnership with the mitigation fund for Ohaaki Geothermal Power Station) to develop a large new wetland that will enhance wetland values in the upper Waikato River vicinity.

During 2007/08 there was activity relating to the registration of the Trust with the NZ Charities Commission. This stringent process included examination of our Trust deed by the Commission's lawyers who determined that our third objective was invalid:

- 3) To receive monitoring reports on key ecological indicators in order to:
 - identify ecological changes, their causes and implications (including determining the extent of Mighty River Power's influence on these changes);
 - (b) identify whether ecological changes are in accordance with Mighty River Power's predictions of ecological changes associated with its operations as set out in the Assessment of Environmental Effects (Taupo Waikato Resource Consents Application and Assessment of Environmental Effects, March 2001, Section 7.7, and its supporting documents).

This was construed by the Charities Commission as being a means whereby the Trust provided a service for Mighty River Power which would invalidate the Trust's status as charitable. After correspondence between the Commission and lawyers acting on behalf of the trust, it was agreed that the third objective was not being implemented and did not contribute in any part to the purpose of the Trust. Accordingly the Trust Deed was amended so as to delete it.

This has been a year in which Trustees have taken the opportunity to review the progress made in the past four years and evaluate the Trust's strategic direction and project investment policies. Previous reports have highlighted Trustees intention to identify key locations in which investment to foster ecological resources that will have greatest impact on the sustainability of the Lake Taupo and Waikato River catchments. This past year criteria for a Gaps Analysis were established and interested parties invited to submit tenders to undertake such an analysis. The ecological districts of Taupo and Meremere are, in the view of Trustees, under the greatest immediate threat and were awarded priority for such an

approach upon which to base investment decisions. The Trustees decided that, having already supported a number of large projects in the Taupo district and wanting to ensure themselves that there were no further important opportunities in that area, that the Taupo district should be examined in the first instance.

Following an open tender process a contract was awarded to Alchemists Ltd to undertake a gaps analysis study for the Taupo Ecological District. They reported to the Trust in late 2007 with an analysis of work projects being undertaken by the various agencies in the district, and an indication of those areas that are most vulnerable and hence where Trust investment would be of most value. This report indicated that in fact the immediate opportunities in the Taupo District are being addressed and allows the Trustees to focus on other areas within the catchment.

Alchemists Ltd also provided services to facilitate a business planning workshop to review the Trust's activities and refresh its strategic plan. This meeting was held on 9th October 2007 and the review determined four key areas to be addressed as follows:

- 1. That the Trust structure should allow Trustees to focus more on their governance role with separate operational capability developed, especially with respect to project management
- 2. That there should be greater prioritisation of the Trust's strategic intent to ensure stronger focus on finding and supporting projects that provide direct mitigation of the impacts of the hydro system with such decisions based on and improved process for cost/benefit analysis where the benefits are determined on the basis of ecological outcomes. This would enable the Trust to be more proactive in finding projects to fund and balancing the ratio of large and small projects.
- There should be a clearer determination of the role of the Trust in relation to other agencies working within the catchment and how all parties may better work together.
- There should be a process of reporting and accountability that takes the Trust's targets and
 priorities into consideration and refines its indicators of success in a framework based on
 environmental outcomes.

The strategic review and refreshment process was suspended following the meeting on October 2007. This was mainly because the Trustees' focus turned to the next funding round, however completion of the review has now been set aside for a further period to allow the nature of the co-management agreement between the Crown and iwi for the Waikato River to take shape. The Trust submitted in the early stages of the co-management process and it is likely that further opportunities to work with the parties in the co-management agreement will impact upon the future work of the Trust, Once this becomes clear in 2008/09, Trustees will again reflect on the Trust's role in protecting and enhancing the catchment and incorporate this within the refreshment of future strategy.

There have been no changes to the Trustees during the course of the year. The Trustees for this financial year were:

In addition to the Trustees listed above additional support was provided by Helen Broome until April 2008 in the role of Secretary to the Trust. For the remainder of the year this role was fulfilled by Cherry Connew with additional administrative assistance from within Mighty River Power. Mike Hanaray of Accountants on London provided accounting services and Derek Brewster of ABN Amro Craigs continued to provide the Trustees with investment analysis and advice.

4. Trust Milestones for 07/08

Key milestones for the Trust this year have been:

- Development of criteria for Gaps Analysis in the Meremere and Taupo Ecological Districts with letting of a tender for this activity.
- ii. Maintenance and commencement of an updated the Trust's website at www.wceet.org.nz. This included providing advice on project development and the application process.
- iii. News releases through local and regional media in relation to Trust activities and projects being supported.
- Launch of the Trust's fifth funding round on November 1st 2007, with applications closing 31 January 2008.
- Receipt of 23 applications in response to the Trust's fourth funding round. These application were considered by a sub-committee of Trustees and recommendations made to the full Trust (15 March 2007)
- vi. Following consideration of those applications the Trust made grants to totalling \$188,395 for 2008 as well as committing to payments of \$368,305 for 2009 distributed across the Trust's area. The grants made are detailed in the following table:

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2008

1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

REPORTING ENTITY

The Waikato Catchment Ecological Enhancement Charitable Trust (Inc) was incorporated under the Charitable Trusts' Act 1957, on 22 August 2003. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting practice as defined by Financial Reporting Standards and Statements of Standard Accounting Practice as issued by the New Zealand Institute of Chartered Accountants.

MEASUREMENT BASIS

The accounting principles recognized as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance and financial position have been applied on an historical cost basis.

DIFFERENTIAL REPORTING

These Financial Statements have been prepared by applying differential reporting exemptions. The Waikato Catchment Ecological Enhancement Charitable Trust (Inc) qualifies for these exemptions on the grounds that it is not publicly accountable and is not large.

2 SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following specific accounting policies, which significantly affect the Trust's measurement of results and financial position, have been applied:

1. Taxation

The Trust is registered with the Charities Commission as a charitable entity under the Charities Act 2005, has been granted Charitable status for the purposes of the Revenue Acts, and in particular is exempt from income tax under Section CB4(1)(c) of the Income Tax Act 1994. Accordingly, no provision for taxation has been made on the net income derived during the period to 30 June 2008

2. Goods and Services Tax

The Trust is registered for Goods and Services Tax purposes and the Financial Statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis except that grants approved and unpaid as at balance date are recorded in the Statement of Financial inclusive of GST

3. Investments

Investments are recorded at market value as at balance date.

4. Changes in Accounting Policy

There have been no changes in Accounting Policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those applied in previous years.



3 COMMITMENTS

Outstanding Grants approved but not paid as at balance date have been accrued as Creditors. There are no other commitments at 30 June 2008

4 CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The Trust did not have any contingent liabilities at 30 June 2008 (2007 NIL)

5 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Funding for operations to date has been received from Mighty River Power Limited (MRP) under the terms provided for in the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) of 15 October 2002 between MRP and the Trust. As part of the MoU, MRP has agreed to provide administrative support including the payment of administrative and audit expenses. (Audit fee \$1,500.00)
